# Report on the audit of the Financial Results

### Opinion

Magarwara district Unnao however management is of opinion that realizable value of all assets is not lower than the amount appearing in the books and therefore there is no need to provide for any impairment loss.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of above matter.

# Management's Responsibilities for the Financial Results

These quarterly financial results as well as the year to date financial results have been prepared on the basis of the annual audited financial statements.
